

Ian's Mobile Mechanical Services

Ian Blackburn loves motors. He has always loved fixing mechanical things, from pushbikes and motor bikes to heavy duty farm machinery, and is well-experienced in the world of motors.

lan grew up in north-west England and when he left school he went into an apprenticeship:

"I started off with engineering then the engineering company went belly-up so I was fortunate enough to get into a car dealership leaning towards the more commercial side. Then I ended up at Volvo construction equipment for 7 or 8 years...", says lan.

Ian did fork-truck repair and maintenance for a couple of companies for a few years. Then he worked for a subcontractor for Shell at one of their big refineries, fixing anything from pumps, cars, trucks to excavators:

"I like the heavy stuff but my body doesn't. I had a workplace accident in the early 90s which has caused me a lot of grief so have a lot of osteo-arthritis."

"I worked for a friend who had a breakdown recovery business so to earn extra income I did a lot of after-hours work and weekends with motorway break down and fatal accident recovery stuff. Motorways in the UK are extremely busy and dangerous places.", says lan.

After first coming to New Zealand for their honeymoon, lan and his wife Andrea decided to return and make it their permanent home:

"I persuaded Andrea that it might be a better future for us to come out here...It was harder for Andrea as she has a big family but I finally persuaded her", says lan.

They have been in New Zealand for 15 years now, first living outside of Wellington on a lifestyle block. They planned to move down to this area to retire but with health issues and wanting to lead a less stressful life, they decided that "life was too short" and moved down earlier to Motueka.

Since moving to Ngatimoti 14 months ago, Andrea and lan and their two jack russells have been living in a caravan on their two acres. Building has begun on their new log house and they are hoping to move in by winter.

Originally Ian set up his mechanical services business as mobile but now they have resource consent to work from home. They will be building another workshop with a hoist making work easier for Ian:







"Basically I haven't really advertised, except the newsletter, it's just gone by word of mouth...I'm getting quite a lot of repeat business now."

Andrea adds: "It's about building up that trust, quite a few local customers come back because they trust you...". Andrea is well-versed in car maintenance too as her father was in the car business.

It's not just cars Ian can fix:

"I've had a few lawnmowers, a couple of tractors, and some quads. I haven't any favourite, I like the variety so every day's different", lan says.

"...Had a couple of people call in, touring in a ute. They'd got a warning light come on the dashboard. I plugged in my reader and basically the fuel filter had become blocked. I managed to take it apart, clean it and basically circumnavigate it to keep 'em going until they got back home, they were from the north island. I said to them: '...it'll be alright for

now but when you get back home get your local garage to fit a new one.' It obviously hadn't been changed in quite a while. The guy was quite miffed as it had only just been serviced."

Ian and Andrea point out that when people are getting a service it's just changing the oil and filter:

"... Air filters, fuel filters, transmission filters and spark plugs are all things that don't get looked at or changed unless it's requested. And that's what keeps a car running smoothly."

The Morris Minor is lan's favourite car. He used to have one in the UK:

"I quite like working on old cars, stuff you can get at. It's a breath of fresh air after working on a lot of modern cars where everything's buried and you have to fight to get at stuff"

As well as working on modern motorbikes, Ian has worked on restoring classic and vintage motorbikes. At the moment, he has a couple of vintage classic bikes- a 1972 Yamaha and a 1952 Triumph.

Tasman BioStrategy

"Tasman is one of the most important places for natural environments in New Zealand...", says Peter Lawless, the independent facilitator of the Tasman BioStrategy Working Group.

Many native species and ecosystems in Tasman are under threat, some already extinct, from introduced weeds and pest animals, and from the way we use land and what we discharge into waterways. To integrate the biodiversity and biosecurity priorities, and as a response to the national Biodiversity Strategy, Tasman District Council (TDC) have commissioned a BioStrategy for Te tai o Aorere (Tasman District).

Work began on the biostrategy 18 months ago with a governance group of Councillors and Iwi representatives, co-governing a working group. The working group has broad representation from conservation, recreation and



agricultural groups of the district. Lawless describes the group as:

"...A combination of people who are knowledge holders about the subject matter of biodiversity and biosecurity and people who are well-connected in the community and understand the needs of different sectors".

Nationally and regionally, a number of reviews and plans for looking after our environment have been completed recently, are underway or due soon — New Zealand Biodiversity Strategy; a National Policy Statement on Indigenous Biodiversity; new National Freshwater

Standards; Nelson Tasman Regional Pest Management Plan; Tasman Long Term Plan.

With both the upcoming review of Tasman Environment Plan, and Central government's review of the Resource Management Act, Lawless sees that there's a lot of change on the horizon:

"All of those things together said it was time for Tasman to get alignment and integration in its thinking about what to do...".

The idea of having a BioStrategy for Tasman is to have "an umbrella" that integrates efforts to protect our environment from biosecurity threats and restore natural ecosystems:

"The strategy doesn't effect anyone's land use directly, it's not a legally binding document. And it's not a document just for Council. It's a living document for the whole of the community that can grow over time...", says Lawless.

The strategy will enable resources to help landowners with their priorities. For example, for groups like Motueka Catchment Collective, the strategy will enable landowners to achieve their objectives of caring for the whole catchment — water monitoring, fencing, riparian plantings.

Post-Covid government spending priorities have meant that \$6million has been allocated to the Top of the South between the four councils to deal with problem weeds:

" At least \$1-2 million will come to Tasman. Do you spend it on public or private land? Our Strategy will say that we know that most significant natural areas on private land are degrading under the pressure of weeds, we have all the evidence sitting there. Most landowners don't have the resources to deal with that.", Lawless says.

Putting on his ecologist hat, Lawless emphasises the importance of Tasman's natural environment:

Tasman has incredibly high diversity, and very great contrasts. Kahurangi National Park is where you have plants and animals that are not found anywhere else in the world. Tasman is the Honey Dew Beech Forest capital of the world, an unusual ecosystem found only on remnants of Gondwanaland, under pressure from introduced wasps..."

Yet, as Lawless points out:

"We've got amazing groups like Project Janzoon, and Health Post working up at Farewell Spit. There are lots and lots of community initiatives - tree plantings near Moutere at the moment, trapping groups like Friends of Flora... we've got these really good building blocks but they're not all brought together anywhere to say: 'How do we best make all these initiatives work together? and 'How do we attract the resources to our region that we need to deal with the issues that we face?'".

Early community engagement has been very important. Eight public meetings have been held around the region, mostly well-attended; a <u>Facebook page</u> reaching 7,000 people, and more than 70 written submissions:

"All that has been analysed and responded to...There will be further consultation when the draft comes out in the middle of the year".

The draft strategy is expected to be in place by Spring:

"Council's response will be really important but equally the response of other sectors – the fishers, farmers, and foresters - will be, at least, as important...", Lawless says.

When complete, the strategy has to be satisfactory to both Council and Iwi.




