2022 Actions of the Motueka Catchment Collective

Jo Leyland, Co-convenor of Motueka Catchment Collective (MCC), writes: Hope the year is off to a good start for everyone and that the summer has been a good one. The recent rain has been very welcome to see the paddocks greening up again. Presumably we will have another hot spell and appreciate river swims before it gets too cold. As we go forward this year, we have the prospect of omicron spreading through our community.

We had planned a meeting in March to share the findings on the research that Tasman District Council (TDC) have been doing over the summer viz gravel in the Motueka river. It follows on from key interest of members and the meeting that we had on flooding last October. We have requested that the TDCC (Tapawera & Districts Community Council) invest in some equipment for the Community Centre so that we can have *Zoom* meetings there. They are exploring what is required but have indicated support, which would potentially be helpful for a range of events & groups in the Tapawera and upper Motueka area. It would mean being able to be more inclusive when using Zoom as some people don't have that internet capacity and it enables a smaller gathering to be able to take part in such meeting events, given that its unwise to hold larger scale meetings in person for the time being. So, we have scheduled the next main meeting for the Motueka Catchment Collective (MMC) to be on Monday, 11th April which is the week leading up to Easter, and it would be via Zoom. It would follow a presentation that is being made by TDC staff to Councillors on the research findings related to gravel. It is a not a simple topic.

There have also been various moves behind the scenes to further develop the Motueka Catchment Collective's (MCC) Action Plan. Our meeting in December, led by Annette Litherland of NZ Landcare Trust was a really good start. There was good representation from eight of the tributary/catchment areas as well as Sherry catchment group, TDC, forestry & ICM stakeholder input.



We agreed on a revision of our Aim so that it now reads:

From an informed and respectful standpoint, facilitate weaving the communities of the Motueka catchment together to ensure the wellbeing of the freshwater system and connected environment.

We looked at what issues the Motueka River/catchment faces in the next twenty years and the outcomes that we would like to see. From that we went through a prioritisation voting exercise to determine the key issues to focus on. The top six came out as:

- Sediment (including gravel) 13
- Weeds especially OMB 11
- Human management of riparian margins 8
- Flooding resilience and climate change 7
- Water quality swimmable/drinkable 7
- Predator control 6

We also discussed the governance for the Motueka Catchment Collective (MCC). The Tasman Environmental Trust (TET) will provide project management services through their Community Conservation Hub https://www.tet.org.nz/conservation-hub/ which enables us to better solicit for funding and support. The MCC is an overarching group for the whole catchment and in some respects we need to look at a whole-of-catchment approach but obviously there are different priorities in different parts of the catchment and different communities with differing actions. Project work and actions would then be mostly at this more local level.

Annette is continuing to develop our Action Plan and she is also drafting up a survey to go out to landowners in the catchment. There are some interesting conversations going on in relation to actions addressing some of these priority issues and we are looking to source funding and support this year which means fleshing out details on priority actions moreso at sub-catchment level. If your sub-catchment or local community wants to be part of this, we want to hear what your key issues are and how to address them. Thanks to those who have communicated those already.

Cherry Homestead: A Wonderful Place To Be

Johan and Emelie Wahlgren and their two sons Loke and Viggo moved to the valley two years ago in 2020. They emigrated from Sweden seven years ago and moved to the Coromandel, where they ran a holiday park with help from Johan's parents and sister. But after five years, they made the decision to come down south: "The holiday park was a hectic lifestyle, on call 24/7, we never had time off" says Emelie, "We felt like we couldn't keep on going by ourselves when Johan's parents retired."

They bought their 6 ½ hectares property on the West Bank, and Johan's sister and parents settled in Nelson. The entire property before various subdivisions over the years was known as Salisbury Farm.

The Wahlgrens arrived just before the first lockdown in February 2020. Johan says: "It was an awkward time to move with Covid and lockdowns but it was an easy move because of the friendly people and the school environment".

Emelie agrees: "It's a beautiful place, everyone is so friendly...It reminds us of Sweden with all the deciduous trees too."



Loke, 10 years old and Viggo, eight years old are students at Ngatimoti school: "They love it, it's an awesome school", says Johan.

Johan and Emelie are aiming to be as self-sufficient as possible: "We want to live more off the farm here and get the income from that...", they say.

Their farm has orchards of plum, apple, pears and quince, with a few established walnut trees around the site as well. There used to be 100 sour cherry trees but as they weren't in good condition and not worth investing in, Johan and Emelie have taken them down. They are planning to expand in that area this winter with Christmas trees: "...just for three years", Johan says.



The farm used to be certified organic for years, but the cost is prohibitive for the Wahlgrens at this stage and they will continue as spray-free. Last year, in one of the paddocks, they planted garlic using three varieties — Printanor, Early New Zealand Purple and Kakanui a New Zealand heirloom:

"We have had our first harvest", says Johan, "and we sold just a small batch, 13kg, and kept most for it for ourselves as seed collection for next season. As the property was an old tobacco farm we still have the old drying rooms to use."

In Sweden, as well as doing forestry work and fencing, Johan was a qualified carpenter. He has set himself up here offering handyman services – firewood, gardening work, weed eating, property clean-ups, as well as building services and renovations. While at home all summer with the kids as Emelie was working, Johan is busy again doing a variety of jobs for people around the valley.

Emelie, a nurse in Sweden, has just started working at Greenwood Health as a health-care assistant. She is also an artist and uses driftwood as her medium. Her driftwood art is on display in her studio along with some furniture reconditioning to which Johan also contributes.

Also on their property they have a self-contained, one bedroom cottage with a lounge and kitchen, and a sleep-out with two additional beds, to accommodate up to five people. Well-experienced as accommodation providers, Johan and Emelie have renovated these during lockdown and offer them as BnB accommodation:

"Covid has made it difficult for tourist accommodation. We had bookings from kiwis with a lot of one night bookings only and cancellations before Christmas but we still ended up fully booked for four or five weeks. We were able to rent it out for short-term before Christmas and now again for a few months."




