# Gesslers on the Go Amaka Olympic Athlete

Four months after breaking her elbow, damaging ligaments and suffering a concussion from an over- the- handlebars, headfirst cycle accident, Amaka Gessler has qualified 3rd in the Olympics trials for the women's 4x200m freestyle relay.

Amaka "jumped for joy" last Tuesday night knowing she will be going to London as part of the Olympic swim team at the end of July this year. She was especially ecstatic as she had missed out on the 2008 Beijing Olympics due to a technicality.

At the age of eight, Amaka saw a medal her older sister lnes brought home from a swimming event and wanted one so bad that she started swimming and training. 250 medals later (but who's counting) including a bronze and silver at the Commonwealth Games in Delhi in 2010 for the 4x100m and 4x200m freestyle relay, and a silver medal from the 2011 World University Games in China for the 4x200m freestyle, she is hoping to bring another one back for her collection from the Olympics this year. Amaka's specialities are the 100m and 200m freestyle and the relay races bring out her best. 21 year old Amaka studies and trains in Auck-

land. She received a scholarship from the High Performance Centre three years ago to train and use the facilities of the Millennium Institute of Sport and Health. Her day starts with two hours of swimming and one hour in the gym, followed by self-motivated extramural study for a BSc in Psychology through Massey University, which is flexible with athletes' training schedules. Another two hours training in the evening rounds off Amaka's day. Sunday is a rest day unless she is training for a specific event. Needless to say her social life is minimal. She comes home to Ngatimoti and the Motueka Valley café, twice a year for a week with her family at Christmas and Easter.

After competing at the 2012 Olympics in London, Amaka plans to spend a couple of months in Germany with her parents and touring Eu-

rope. Her coach and trainers think she will peak in 2016 for the Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, Amaka says she'll wait and see.....

All the best for London this year Amaka. You go girl!

## **Ines Trailwalker**

Big sister, Ines Gessler has just completed a 100km walk on the annual Oxfam Trailwalker. Teams of four walk 100kms in under 36 hours to raise money and awareness for a safer, fairer, and sustainable world.

Ines and her team, "the Ministry of Silly Walks" took 23 hours and 42 minutes walking through the night, with 7 pit stops of about 15-20 minutes. The course was in and around the scenic town of Taupo.


