MVA 18th April Meeting

The MVA joined in with many other submitters to the TDC Draft 10 year Plan and commented against the proposed withdrawal of funding towards the Great Tasman Taste Trail. The reasons went something like this . . .

In our community plan 2004/5 one of the MVA goals stated was to develop walk/cycle trails for our area & to research paper roads, reserve & public areas & land titles along the Motueka river for this purpose.

In 2008 with increasing number of cyclists on the Motueka highway, the MVA asked TDC to erect signs alerting motorists to cyclists & encouraged cyclists to wear high viz gear.

However, the MVA made little progress on the developing of trails as the land usage issues are complicated, a probable lack of usage (trails need to be used or they get overgrown), concerns with maintenance, (who would maintain & who would pay?) and costs generally - budgets & engineering issues were beyond our skill base.

2011 saw an opportunity arise with the Nelson Tasman Loop Trail planned by the Nelson Tasman Cycle Trails Trust with kick-off funding from central government. The Cycle Trust was invited to a MVA meeting and a MVA trail subgroup was formed to work on the route up the valley.

It now seemed that a cycle/walk trail up the Motueka river could become a reality. The Nelson Tasman Cycle Trails Trust helps negotiating land issues, has engineering experience & know how and is developing a maintenance plan with realistic funding. With the loop 170km concept attractive to touring cyclists there'd be increased usage with visitors as well as locals making it more viable. And costs would be boosted by central and local government funding.

We all know that the gem of the Motueka valley is the river. However there is very little access apart from some fishing access and generally people drive down the Motueka valley with just a glimpse of the river every now & then. The Motueka highway cannot be widened (land usage restrictions & a huge expense as there is no Transit funding for this non-highway) and a better/cheaper solution is to build a separate walk/cycle trail.

The general push for the Great Tasman Taste Trail is because of obvious regional commercial benefits. These economic effects will build and ripple through the community. However, the MVA sees that the benefits for the local residents in their own daily lifestyles are just as important. Walking or cycling in rural areas like ours, you are forced onto the main road. Even kids going to school are discouraged because it's too dangerous. As you see in Nelson & Motueka towns – put the trails in and they get used.

Councillor Norriss always emphasizes that TDC needs to concentrate on core services and that we (MVA) need to look at unnecessary expenses & projects to cut from the LTP. We believe that bike trails ARE a core transport service & funding must be negotiated as such. TDC must show leadership in acknowledging that bike/walk trails are core transport (not only recreation).
