Internet Connection.

Thanks to those that contacted us re internet signal. It appears that Vodafone has one 3G tower in Nelson, one in Motueka and a repeater on the hill near Waiwhero Road. Telecom has their 3G tower on Mt Campbell. This explains why reception can vary depending on where you live as the reception relies on line of sight for a good signal.

Some wireless broadband work through a USB stick others a modem or satellite dish. I was advised to go direct to providers for the best deal and with Telecom we get 3 out of 5 bars reception (instead of only one with Vodafone) and they gave us a 7 days trial. It pays to shop around and it depends on your usage and where you live as to what system is most suitable. Ian Davey 5268 707
