Local Community Halls

At the MVA April meeting there was much discussion on how well we in the Motueka Valley are endowed with community facilities (see photos). The rooms offer a variety of venues for small to large functions, from meetings to weddings. Ngatimoti Memorial Hall and the Ngatimoti Reserve Community Room (at Firestation) are financially supported by TDC but Pokororo and Stanleybrook receive no funding from TDC. All have local committees that look after the management and maintenance of the buildings.



Each venue has a regular user group which is excellent; Ngatimoti Memorial Hall has been regularly used for practices by the marimba group, Chimuka. The Ngatimoti Community room is regularly used for yoga, Qi Gong, art group, meetings and by a variety of other groups. Pokororo hall is regularly used by the Women's Group and Stanleybrook is the regular venue for a group of tabletennis players.





However usage is generally low and it was decided that the MVA would promote one function in each of the venues per year - @ Ngatimoti Memorial Hall there will be the celebrations for the 100th birthday of the Peninsula bridge. @ Pokororo Hall there will be an evening of live storytelling. @ Stanleybrook Hall there will be a country dance. @ Ngatimoti Community Room & Reserve there will be a summer barbq.
