The Motueka river separates our valley lives into east and west banks and there are a few bridges that make the river crossing much easier and safer. But none so old and beautiful as the Peninsula bridge which was opened on 4th July 1913. Every valley resident will have many experiences, photographs, memories and stories that have taken place on, under, over or by this elegant bridge. So let's get together and honour her century;



2.30pm: speeches, stories and meanderings on the westbank end of the bridge

3.30pm: afternoon tea at the Bowling club

5.30pm : community pot-luck at the Ngatimoti Memorial Hall

There'll be ample parking on the Beatson's property (westbank) and around the hall. So if driving to the event, please approach the bridge from the side you want to park so there are as few cars crossing the bridge as possible at this time. Come in period costume to help set the scene if you wish.

In the Ngatimoti Memorial Hall there will be a display of historial photographs and movies and also of bridge-related creativity by the pupils of Ngatimoti School. If you have any bridge memoribilia, photographs or stories to add to this display, please bring them to the hall (preferably before noon). The hall will be open from 10am and the display will stay for the evening.

For the Community Pot-luck, the MVA will provide a big pot of soup with bread and mulled apple

juice, tea and coffee. Everyone is to bring a dish (of food) to share and also your own plates, eating utensils and anything else you need to drink. The hall will be warmed for you and there'll be plenty of time for eating, drinking and talking interspersed with a few more stories, some music and braziers outside for the 'around the fire' stories.
