Happy Birthday Peninsula Bridge!



As the crowds gathered on the west bank of the Motueka River, by the Ngatimoti Bowling Club, the sun made a grand entrance along with Lester Rountree's Clydesdales and wagon for the celebration on Saturday 6th July remembering the Peninsula Bridge's 100th birthday. A collection of vintage cars and period agricultural implements followed in a procession from the Ngatimoti Memorial Hall crossing the bridge in style adding to the ambience of early 20th century life in the Motueka Valley.

The men's work camp, equipped with Union building, named work shovels, camp fire, clothes line and leg of beef set the scene for remembering what life was like 100 years ago prior to the building of the Peninsula Bridge which eased the connection from west to east over the Motueka River.

The Peninsula Bridge, resplendent with bunting and banners, was blessed and Guthrie Beatson told several stories including the missing pier, washed away in the flood of 1911, but still visible today.

Trevor Norris, as a representative of Tasman District Council, spoke about the work TDC has done over the years to keep the Motueka Valley connected with upgrades to the local bridges and warned us to care for our Peninsula Bridge by making sure we respect the weight capacity.

John Crick entertained with a poem/song from the point of view of the bridge and tried to engage the crowd in song with mixed results. And then the crowd of over 100 dispersed to the back of the Ngatimoti Bowling Club for tea and scones as stories were swapped and locals caught up with each other in typical country style, reflecting life in the Motueka Valley for over a century.

As well as enjoying the fine variety of dishes brought to the community pot-luck in the evening, everyone was most impressed by Ngatimoti school's colourful display. An array of artistic works including bright paintings & pencil drawings, detailed sketches & expansive riverscapes, structural drawings & surreal creations, along with model bridges and poems surrounded the hall and complemented the historical photos, articles and stories.

The evening drew to a close with live folk music and the stage was alive with a beautiful interpretation of folk dancing from the local young ones.
