Vandalism to Memorial Hall

About the 25th June five windows in the Ngatimoti Memorial Hall were broken with stones. There were between 30 and 50 stones from the car park used to throw at the Hall breaking the windows, spouting and chipping stucco and paint on the wall. It appears High School students waiting for the bus were responsible for the damage and it is being followed up by the Motueka Police to make reparations.

This mindless vandalism also desecrates a Hall built in memorial to those men and women who died in the World Wars so we can have freedom and democracy.

It is not only the direct cost to replace the windows but the disappointment that some would stoop to such acts of wilful damage to our public amenity. Ratepayers end up paying the bill unless those responsible are made to pay. I Davev

Overall crime has been steady and due to the increasing fuel prices we are starting to get the following increase in fuel related

We have also have a significant increase in poaching related activity with a number of arrest for Unlawful Hunting throughout the District.

We have had some good success with locating some hunters in the Gowan Valley and the Waihopai - they are going through the courts at the moment.

The guys in Murchison have some strong leads in relation to the thefts and burglaries in the St Arnaud Area but would still like to hear from anybody with information.

The Takaka boys have asked me to pass on issues with their community not getting serial numbers from their property documented. They had issues trying to identify property taken from a thief they caught in Takaka.

One of my guys was hunting up in the Shaggery off the Westbank Road in Motueka and found a sheep carcass with an eartag labelled "PUNAWAI" - does anybody have any ideas where this may have come from?
