Great Spotted Kiwi Update

The 12 new immigrant kiwi were brought into the Flora fom New Creek (near Inangahua) and Roaring Lion last summer.

Monitoring is essential to determine whether the kiwi remain within the project area, survive, breed and therefore achieve the goal of re-establishing a sustainable kiwi population in the Flora.

However, the kiwi have wandered much more widely than the original ones did. It is currently 14 km from the most southerly to the most northerly located kiwi. So monitoring is a major challenge! Two pairs seem to have established territories, 2 other partnerships seem to be loosely paired and settled but the remaining birds are still wandering.

Last Saturday 2 teams of 4 went up the Flora with spades and dug soil samples to check on worm and kiwi food richness to assess if this could be one of the reasons for the wandering.



The kiwi in the Flora carry radio transmitters. Our kiwi monitoring team track them from a distance to learn where they are and how active they are at night, an indicator as to whether they are breeding. This information is essential to understand whether we are on track to achieve a sustainable kiwi population in the Flora. The monitoring involves long days in the bush, often off track, with long periods stationary, sometimes on freezing ridge tops, trying to pick up elusive 'beeps' from the transmitters. But if you enjoy a challenge the experience is very rewarding. You receive training in radio telemetry, and you don't need to worry about gym fees! Another very successful Festival day was a result of the work of so many people working together. Special thanks to all parents; the organisers of each "department" and their teams as well as to the organizing committee including Lisa, Kirsten and Amanda. The Festival is a very demanding day and we really appreciate the lengths many of you took to ensure it was as good as it was! If you do have any feedback, positive or constructive, please let us know. There is a box on the office desk for any thoughts or comments. Also in this box, you might like to make any suggestions for what you would like to spend any of the profits on. At this stage we cannot let you know how much profit we have actually made, but we think it will be at least \$20,000.

Festival funds from last year were spent in a variety of ways to ensure all students benefitted! Each year we aim to purchase something significant, as well as ensure we have funds so we do not need to ask parents for too much money during the year for trips, travel and performances. Our major purchases using festival funds from last year were a new set of gymnastics mats, ipads and a TV display screen and literacy resources for classrooms. As well we have paid for bus hire for sports trips, museum trips and subsidized class trips to Lake Rotoiti. We have also used funds for our MASSIVE costumes and equipment, paid for all students for the Bob Bickerton music show, Reading Rocks show and The Big Sad Wolf show. We have paid for specialist teacher support for computers and we have provided a class photo to every child. Having this funding has also allowed us to send some students to an "Inspire Day" and subsidise skiing for Room 2. We have also saved \$10,000 of our Festival profit from last year to put towards an adventure playground upgrade in the future. Funds raised from this year will be used in a variety of ways too! At this stage we are considering building a concrete wall at the back of the tennis courts for kicking or hitting a ball against, having a major focus on library resources and continuing to pay for bus travel for class trips. We hope to put something aside towards the

playground upgrade too! Any other suggestions are most welcome – please let Ali know your thoughts or come and pop a sug-
