MVA June Meeting

Twenty-two residents turned out for this meeting which focused primarily on the TDC plan to realign and rebuild the Ngatimoti narrow bridge. There was much discussion and reviewing of the sequence of events leading to the public announcement of these works. Trevor Norriss told the meeting that the decision still remained dependent upon NZTA's agreement for the 59% subsidy. A motion was unanimously passed "the community supports the rebuilding of the narrow bridge at Ngatimoti".

Trevor also reported that the Rural Futures process was signed off by TDC on Tues 17th June and in 6-8 weeks would be out for submissions.

Ian Davey reported back from a Motueka meeting on Smart Meters. It was proposed to have a local evening (to be arranged) presenting both sides of the issue.

Post meeting Trevor sent the following;

"we have received confirmation that the New Zealand Transport Agency Board have confirmed support and the 59% subsidy rate for the narrow bridge replacement and re alignment project. The design work and any other related issues will now commence and hopefully come up with a tender price that fits into councils allocated budget. Also the Pokororo swing bridge repairs are also on our contractors list of jobs to do".

Goodbye Mr. Rogers

"He was a cool old man," an ex-pupil's description of Trevor Rogers when she heard of his recent death.

Tributes flowed at the packed Ngatimoti Memorial Hall when Trevor's friends gathered to support the Rogers family at an emotional funeral service on Monday 30th June.

Born and bred into a pioneering Taranaki family, Trevor remained a proud and parochial Taranaki son with great knowledge and interest in all things Maori. He taught in the Taranaki, in Northland and had sole charge at Mangarakau. In the early 1980's Trevor and family shifted to Ngatimoti and through his involvement with our school and various clubs and interest groups he and his family became honourary Ngatimoti locals! Arriving as this tall dark-haired teacher (yes Trevor's hair and beard were once black), he soon became a well-known and respected and well-liked member of our local and wider community.

Along with his love of sharing his knowledge, story telling, dry wit, jokes (during a phase of bringing pet mice to the school Trevor said "yuk, mice smell" "No they don't Mr Rogers" "Yes they do. Mice have noses") and games (Trevor's Rounders), his many interests were his vege garden, hunting, fishing and a love of the great outdoors. Also beer brewing - water from the school's bore water supply made for a "better brew."

In later years lawn bowls became a passion for Trevor although claiming when he was a young fit man"You'll never see me on a bowling green". He was a member and great supporter of the "Morrie Minor" club as well as the pastel painting art group. Some of his wonderful still-life and landscape paintings were on display at his farewell. He had a love of animals and a great passion for collecting all sorts of memorabilia, especially early NZ items.

Above all else, Trevor was a family man and his and Madeline's lives were intertwined, always enquiring, learning and giving. He was a 'cool man', a fitting epitaph for an extraordinary man

LOCALS STANDING STRONGLY FOR RIGHTS TO 1080-FREE ENVIRONMENT

21 people attended the third public meeting of Friends of New Zealand (FONZ) at the Pokororo Hall on Wednesday 25 June.

FONZ is a local group organised in response to the proposed aerial 1080 Poisoning in the Baton, Arthur, Pearse and Graham valleys.

Residents were updated on negotiations with the Medical Officer of Health and the Tasman District Council. Both need to sign approvals before 1080 poisons are used.

Golden Bay's Bill Wallace of the newly formed BAN 1080 political party told residents, "DoC have no baseline data on native bird populations in the previously unpoisoned 89,000 hectare Tasman Wilderness Area of Kahurangi National Park .They need to lead by example and adhere to the same strict rules they insist on for other Resource Consent applicants. In particular, before and after science on the poisoned impact site and an unpoisoned control site in conservation areas. "

DoC's new code of practice for aerial 1080 in kea habitat (June 2014) has a series of standards for rat numbers and timing of the drops, but then has Code exemption: where the standards can be over-ridden at the discretion of the manager approving the permission.

A unanimous motion was carried for FONZ to affiliate with New Zealand Wildlife Biodiversity Management Society Inc (NZWBMS), an organisation that has been actively advising FONZ in regard to proper procedures to follow regarding 1080 aerial poison permit processes.

The surrounding landowners are also targets with theft and damage to their properties
