ELECTRIC POWER "SMART METERS" ARE TO BE IN-

STALLED ON YOUR SWITCH BOARD UNLESS YOU SAY NO.

Are you happy to have your electric power bill double in price without any benefit? This seems to be a common result where-ever in the World "Smart Meters have been installed to replace the original Analogue Meters allowing power companies to increase charges through "Time of Use Tariffs." Other serious concerns are "Smart Meters" causing fires, privacy of data gathering that can be on-sold, cyber attack and health issues from these continually pulsing meters.

On the 1st August 2014, the Provincial Government of Saskatchewan Canada, ordered the replacement of all the 105,000 " smart meters" which had been installed at a total cost of \$47 million after several fires were caused by the "smart meters".

In the future we are told that to get the most from the "Smart Meter" we need to replace all our electrical appliances with the new generation appliances that can send and receive information. Imagine the cost to the consumer but a bonanza to companies making and selling electrical appliances!

The Electricity Authority of N.Z. requires all power meters to be re-certified by April 2015.

Starting from 1st September, Network Tasman is to change all mechanical Analogue Meters with "Smart meters" at a cost to Network Tasman of \$15 million. "Smart meters use radio frequency radiation in the microwave spectrum capable of two-way transmission of data about electricity use.

A documentary DVD on the topic "TAKE BACK YOUR POWER" will be shown at the Ngatimoti Community Rooms on Friday 15th and Sunday 17th August at 7:30 pm.

The MVA AGM will be on Wednesday 20th August where Mr. Stanton spokesman for Network Tasman will give a talk and answer questions on the roll-out of "Smart Meters."

Life Saving Machines Installed

The long awaited defibrillators are now installed and ready for use, if and when there is a medical emergency requiring them. A HUGE thank you to all who put the effort into making this happen ... from the individual who spearheaded this idea, Glen Davenport and to Kerry and Paula Hall, who have so kindly installed one of the machines at their business, and everyone in between.

The defibrillator machines (commonly known as AED's) are located at the entrance to the Community Rooms at the Ngatimoti Reserve and at Woodstock Automotive, 1982 Dovedale Road, Woodstock.

On the 5th of June approximately 18 community members gave up their evening to learn CPR and how to use the AED. These individuals are willing to step up in an emergency and use their skills to assist in an emergency requiring CPR and an AED machine. In a separate flyer we will distribute a list of names and phone numbers that you can use in case 111 has advised you to uplift the AED from one of the two locations. These individuals are willing to volunteer their time and skills to retrieve the AED and bring it to the location of the emergency and assist with CPR and the use of the machine.

Please remember your first point of call is 111. The volunteers are NOT paramedics, EMT's, doctors or nurses, they are individuals who can assist in the use of the machine and perform CPR.

If you already know how to perform CPR you can easily use one of these machines as they will talk you through the procedure when you open the box. If you have someone with you who can go and retrieve the machine while you continue CPR that would be your quickest response to possibly saving that person's life.

Remember time is of the essence and if you are aware of the location of the AED machines ... the sooner you retrieve it the better the prospect of a good outcome.

Please be aware that when the storage box containing the AED is opened an alarm will sound and a red light will flash.

Our hope in the community is that many of you will consider learning CPR as it can not only save a neighbours life but it could be your life being saved.






