Our whakatauki for this term is about caring for the environment.

This is very appropriate for the environmental messages, but also for the upcoming cyber-safety messages we will be promoting.

In class for the remainder of term 4; maths programmes continue, with most classes finishing a unit involving money and now learning about algebra and geometry. All classes are learning about our precious water and water energy, and have been learning about endangered animals. Later this term our focus will be on staying safe online, and we have booked John Parsons to spend a day with classes, as well as running an afterschool staff meeting and an evening session for parents. Our senior students are heading to Lake Rotoiti for camp with an overnight tramp to Lake Head hut, kayaking and mountain biking being just some of the experiences on offer! Planning for 2015 has started. Teachers have been discussing possible classes for next year. At this stage we are expecting to have four classrooms again, with a class of Year 1 and 2, a class of Year 3 and 4, a class of Year 5 and 6 and a class of Year 7 and 8 students. Although numbers are uneven, we can target needs more specifically by grouping in this way.
