Music and More

I remember hearing "Grandad's Wedding," a music duo of 8 year old Billy on drums and his dad, Glen, on guitar playing some heavy duty self-written songs at the Mountain Valley School years ago. Billy (now 15) still plays music and played in the Motueka High School Jazz Combo at the October Ngatimoti Festival.

His dad, Glen Bathgate, also played but with his other son, Ocean (9) on keyboard.

And Glen's partner "Kath Bee" performed her own songs for "Kiwi Kids".

Glen and Kath together set up the entertainment stage, including all the sound gear and organised the line-up of other performers as well as themselves to keep the festival goers in fine fettle.

Glen is well-known to all the Ngatimoti School kids where he motivates, enthuses and teaches music - guitar, ukulele and recorder and prepares the school band for various inter-school Quests. Originally a punk rocker and a member of various Dunedin bands, he decided to study guitar and writing music himself at the Nelson School of music. Following this course Glen did a gig with Billy at his grandfather's wedding which became the name of the father and son 'band'. He still plays in other bands including "Shunt," one of the bands at the Ngatimoti Memorial hall gig in October.

In 2000 Kath studied contemporary music and original composition at the Nelson School of Music, after which she worked more in the field of children's music and became familiar with Learning Media. She decided "I could write songs like that" and had 3 songs published. Kath has recently had a video produced for one of her songs, "Dragons under my Bed" which won an Australasian music video award. When I visited them in the Pearse Valley they'd just returned from the Steiner School Spring Fair where Kath had performed some of her "Kiwi Kids' songs" in front of a bouncing, appreciative audience. Billy was cooking a delicious smelling curry and Ocean was repeating science experiments he'd learnt at school.

There are plenty of varied activities to keep life interesting and challenging in this household. Both Glen and Billy are right into multisport; running, biking, swimming – hence you might see Glen swimming UP the Motueka river in the summer. They've competed successfully in local, regional and national triathlons and even in the 2014 World Triathlon Championship. So the latest development for Glen is to set up a fitness-based coaching business. He wants to create programmes for people to achieve their (fitness) goals – " not life coaching but get-off-the-couch coaching." He's pretty enthusiastic so he might get all of us out and on our bikes!
