Charmwood Alpacas

Soft, warm, light, colourful and with a 'low prickle factor', Davina Clarke's woven lap rugs are a wonderful result of two of her passions; natural fibre and the tartans of Scotland.

Twelve years ago a heavily pregnant Davina moved from the Waikato with her husband, John and 1 son. They had bought the land 4 years earlier and during that time John had pendulumed down to plant trees and build the house. A very different lifestyle from the Morrinsville library where she worked awaited . . .

... 3 sons; Knightly, Kingsley and Rupert, forests of pine, eucylyptus, lucitanica, macracapa, Tasmanian blackwood, redwood and douglas fir (some stands are now ready for harvest), a small herd of (18) beef cattle, 22 alpaca (built up from the original 3), a new puppy and an expansive view down into the valley.

In those earlier years, alpaca were a new market in NZ and most stock was kept for breeding purposes. But Davina, being a stay-at-home Mum of 3 little boys, developed a strong interest in the beautiful long-stapled, black, brown, white alpaca fibre (there are actually 22 different colours). She pulled the spinning wheel out of storage and joined the monthly Motue-ka spinning group which she still attends. Then came the question; what to do with the yarn? because "I suck at knitting". But luckily she discovered weaving. She bought a floor loom and the mammoth effort to learn the intricacies of the loom itself and the preparation work began. The thread calculations and setting up preparations (especially for traditional tartans) are about 80% of the work involved. Davina can weave any tartan just from a picture. She loves working out the thread counts. "The actual weaving is easy."

Davina sells her weaving and other products like packets of dyed alpaca fleece and hanks of alpaca mix yarn at festivals or through word-of-mouth and commissions but her focus lies more with education and the promotion of natural fibre. She's keen to promote awareness of 'where your clothes come from'. And the advantages of natural compared to oil-based fibres which "melt and burn your skin when you get too close to fire". Natural fibres are also now tested for 'the prickle factor'

to help discard the memory of scratchy wool singlets.

So today their alpaca are kept for their fleece and friend-ship. Fleece with a staple 10cm+ in length (which is about 10 to 20% of the fleece produced) is sent away to be commercially spun which is then woven by Davina. The rest is cleaned, carded, combed, dyed (sometimes) and spun at home. There are 3 looms and 2 spinning wheels at home and even the boys have woven bags and scarves on the table loom and Rupert is learning to knit. Davina obviously loves the creativity, the planning, the meditative doing and the end product satisfaction of her natural fibre work.

"It's a craft that's coming back" claims Davina, unused looms and wheels hidden for years in attics are slowly coming out.

Some interesting things about alpaca;

- pregnancy lasts 11.5months but if the weather is bad (wet & cold) the mother and babe can hold on at least another 6 months.
- are shorn on a tilting table once a year carefully, as they have sensitive skin.
- spit especially when pregnant or establishing a hierarchy.
- are good with children, affectionate, and make good pets
- are social herd animals so never have just one lonely alpaca.
