## **Possums**

Are you seeing more pesky possums about the place? This might be because TBfree NZ is scaling down its possum control work east of the Motueka River.

Nick Hancox from TBfree says this is because after more than 10 years of very effective possum control, there is now little risk of possums carrying bovine tuberculosis to cattle or deer herds east of the river.

"This is a great result, and we are very grateful for the hard work of our local possum control contractors and the assistance of residents and landowners."

The downside will be more possums in east bank gardens and orchards, because TBfree NZ will move some of its funding to areas of greater TB control need. It might be time for some community discussion about this risk. The MVA Committee will help in this as best we can – watch this space.

HAVING A GROWTH MIND SET: This is an attitude we are discussing regularly at school.

'When I am frustrated, I persevere.' Compare this with 'When I am frustrated, I give up.'

'When I make a mistake, I learn.' Compare this with 'When I make a mistake, I feel I am no good.'

In our Ngatimoti School vision, the phrase 'confident and able to navigate in a changing world' acknowledges that there will be challenges and struggles. We have to help our children to be resilient, understanding and accepting, whilst also being confident and able to problem solve.

MATHS: You may have heard on the news that there is some debate about maths teaching recently. In 2001 the MOE introduced the Numeracy Project. The numeracy project involves using a lot of resources, such as an abacus, a hundreds board or counters, so kids can see how maths works. Mathematical thinking and problem solving come to the fore with this project, but basic facts knowledge is still taught and expected. This method (the numeracy project) has been defended by some, saying that kids are building on basic maths facts to be flexible thinkers. Those against say we have swung too far from rote learning and the strategies take too long to find the right answer.

What happens at Ngatimoti School? We do strongly believe in learning basic facts, but we also believe that there needs to be some logical understanding of these basic facts. When we are learning to memorise facts, we should also be able to show or explain how they work, in order to apply them.

Food and Nutrition has featured as a learning area for all classes this term, with Room 3 extending the learning by cooking up healthy shared lunches for their class. Riley looks very happy with this delicious looking quiche, which used some silverbeet from a school garden. Many thanks to Lesley for your culinary expertise and superb management skills!



SCIENCE: All classes will be presenting some of their learning in science on Wednesday 24 June. We have all been discovering just how much science goes on around us!
