### **GROWING SEEDS**

Pete's absolute wonder and enthusiasm as he sees the emerging little green tops of germinating seeds is indicative of his passion in growing healthy native plants. It is matched only by Hannah's vibrant descriptions of the single-seeded oyster spat that she tends and coaxes. There are naturally differences in their work – he grows his species in earth, she grows her species in water – but there are also similarities in the goals, systems, threats of virus, need to respond to markets etc and most of all in the appeal of the challenges and the stimulation to these two multi-taskers who have both had very varied paths to arrive at their present lifestyle on Westbank.

As a 15year old Pete did a horticulture and beekeeping cadetship in Motueka but moved quickly into hospitality and with the energy that sticks with him, he set up Redcliff Cafe and Bar in Te Anau (check it out - he sold it to the present owners and it's a multi award winning cafe). Continuing with hospitality, he worked for Real Journeys as a chef on their Fiordland cruise boats. He enjoyed being at sea but took on a different focus when he became the "oldest trainee lobster fisher" and worked inshore crayfishing. He moved from small boats to Sealords big fishing trawlers but with the downturn in hoki quotas, he altered direction again and became an observer on the super trawlers. This job took him to sea for up to 100 days at a time and from the tropics to the Antarctica. It also gave him plenty of time to get into his horticultural books and start dreaming of land life. So about 12 years ago he bought 10 acres with good water, 4-bay shed, 1 rolled out weedmat and the 'Spencer castle house' and started to develop his business "Westbank Natives."

With a basis of trial and error, observation and analysis Pete's pretty happy with his business today which has evolved out of 'growing native plants' (interesting to note the increasing difficulty in collecting true lines of seed due to the proliferation of nursery-introduced hybrids). Today he does project planting, landscaping, revegetation, erosion control, riparian and boundary plantings, commercial engineered housesites, community and group plantings, grows on contract but also still enjoys supplying the small town gardener. team in planting season, "We get stuck in and don't muck around" because the window of opportunity is pretty small.

When Hannah left school, the range of careers for girls were teaching or nursing! Hannah chose nursing but after becoming a mother herself, she was inspired to become a midwife. She was involved in Homebirth for many years in Hamilton then came down to Nelson where she successfully set up a Homebirth group. When her daughter was studying at Nelson Polytechnic, she had a yearning to do more study too and did a Science Diploma and found part-time work at the Cawthron Institute. A BSc. later and many years experience in the hatchery, Hannah is now a major part of the team at the Cawthron Aquaculture centre at the Glen, the only Pacific Oyster hatchery in NZ. The spat goes from the hatchery to a nursery and then on to the oyster farms in N Auckland and the resulting oysters bear almost no resem-



blance to the ones you find on the rocks. For the oyster farmers, meat to shell ratio, meat size, disease resistance and visuals are important features (flavour is less genetic and more environment dependent). Hannah says, "I'm still involved in looking after broodstock – incubation, fertilisation, creating perfect conditions for embryo."

Pete and Hannah agree that their recreation, hobby, work and life interests all seem to roll into one and that suits them just fine . . . for now . . . but maybe with a little divergence somewhere


