- Wendy Whitehead and Stefan Lerbs have advised they will no longer be available to work on production of the MVA newsletter thanks to them both. Maintaining the newsletter is now another challenge for the new committee. Help will be welcome!

He provided an update on continuing work and planning for the Great Taste Cycle Trail; TDC's commitment to maintaining the Graham Valley Road, and council planning in regard to multiple dwellings on rural zone properties.


coaching too!
