"By spending as little as an hour or two per week doing yoga, you may notice benefits such as: aches and pains diminish (especially back pain), muscles become more toned and flexible, energy level increases, concentration improves.

"The physical well-being has a strengthening and calming impact on the mind. These benefits will spread to all aspects of your life. Regular practise will bring you to look at yourself and your goals in a new light.

Home Learning in the Valley - by Kris Kolff

Home learning, often called home schooling, is quite popular in the Motueka Valley. There are about 10 families (with 25 children aged 5-17) choosing this option.

How they do this varies quite a lot. Some families have a school-type structure in the mornings, with optional activities in the afternoon. Others let their kids be self-directed throughout the day, encouraging and helping them. This approach is based on the experience that all children naturally want to learn and they will learn things easily and quickly when they become interested in them.

Through the home learning network in the Valley about four families participate in Waka Ama (outrigger canoe paddling) activity from Kaiteriteri, every Monday morning.

This tends to be a real family event, because almost anyone can paddle and it is a lot of fun. "It is one of the things we love doing as a family!" says Tessa Hiebendaal who with partner Remko, have a four and seven year old. "And it offers a wealth of opportunities for learning - team work, raising awareness around safety on the water, learning about weather patterns, wind/currents/ tides, swell, Maori culture etc."

The Home-education choir that meets at Riverside Community is another weekly activity popular with several families from the Valley. When they performed at The Top of the South Choir Gathering in Motueka recently, they got a standing ovation!

Touch Rugby in Motueka is played weekly during spring and summer by children from the Valley, who formed a team called The Untouchables.

The Motueka Home-learners group is a network with about 35 local families connected through email and regular meet-ups. The Tasman Home Educators covers the wider Motueka and Nelson area and has about 90 families on their email list.

The Ministry of Education grants exemptions to formal schooling after quite a detailed application has been filed. There are almost 3,000 families in New Zealand who choose to home-educate approximately 6,000 children. My own experience, having lived with five home-learning children for the last 10 years, has been one of tremendous joy; watching them grow and mature in their own unique ways. I wish I'd grown up like this!






