There was a full turn out of those standing for the Motueka and Moutere/Waimea wards at the Motueka Valley Association's annual general meeting and meet-the-candidates night on September 7 at the Ngatimoti community room.

Around 30 valley residents heard councillor candidates from the Motueka Ward - Barry Dowler, Martin Lucas, Paul Hawkes, David Ogilvie and Peter Canton and from the Moutere/Waimea Ward hopefuls - Anne Turley, Dean McNamara, Andrew Gould, Richard Osmaston, Tim King, Graham Stradling and Gary Watson (report read in absentia).

Outgoing TDC councillor Trevor Norriss chaired the meeting. The candidates responded to questions about how they would know if they were an effective TDC councillor and how they would ensure the views of women, children, young people, Maori and ethnic minorities were reflected in council decisions. They were asked for a yes or no answer on the Waimea community dam. At the AGM, committee member and secretary Nick Hancox's resignation was accepted and the remaining members, Bruce Dyer, Joanna Santa Barbara, Greg Mason and Irma Jager, were joined by Fran Deech and Liz Mahoney.

Committee member Joanna Santa Barbara gave a rundown of the year's events organised by the MVA: these included the brass band concert, Christmas lights on the Peninsula Bridge, Facebook exchanges of value, the newsletter, pest vines campaigner Chris Rowse's presentation, the new weedbusters group, the community potluck and the La Vida concert on November 4. **Treasurer Bruce Dyer said the MVA's good financial position is** partly due to the continuing income from newsletter advertisers. He thanked Trevor Norriss for his contribution to Motueka Valley.

Author talks about birds

Local writers are invited to come and hear former valley resident Faye Bolt discuss her books about the birds in her Orinoco garden and at the Motueka Sandspit at the next Writers at Lunchtime meeting in Nelson on Wednesday October 5.

Retired from a forty-year career teaching music in secondary schools, with more than thirty of those years as Head of Music at Motueka High School, Fay and her husband Derek made a large garden in the Orinoco Valley. There, Fay waited with her camera and watched the birds.

Faye began writing about the birds she had photographed, and with Derek's help, she self-published her first book, *The Bird Garden*. When all 2500 copies sold after its second print-run Fay adapted it to make two e-books – *In the Bird Garden* and *In the Bird Garden Again*. Her third e-book *The Bird Garden Kitchen* reflects her love of cooking for family and friends – as well as her love of food.
