Meeting on health of our rivers and streams



Valley residents interested in the health of rivers and streams of the Motueka catchment are invited to a meeting at Ngatimoti on Wednesday November 2 to discuss their interests and observations.

TDC Environmental scientist Trevor James has new information about our waterways that he's keen to share. "There are now more opportunities for funding to improve the state of waterways than ever before and for the benefit of our streams, we hope that the rate and scale of streamside planting and creation of wetlands can increase."

A thorough analysis of water quality across the district was completed late last year and presented in a 'state of the environment' report (http://www.tasman.govt.nz/environment/water/rivers/riverwater-quality/).

There is good news for the larger rivers in the Motueka Catchment: • They are suitable for swimming 97% of the time (in base

flows this is over 98%) - this is slightly better than Tasman's other major rivers.

• Water clarity is moderately good and improving (Motueka at Woodstock median: 4m). Medians for Motueka Gorge 11.6m, Wangapeka at Walters Peak 7.9m.

• Invertebrate life in the Motueka is nearly always in a excellent ("A") or good ("B") condition

Long stringy algae cover is low.

But there are concerns:

Trout numbers still have not recovered since the 1980's

• Nitrate concentrations continue to rise (over the last 26 years at Woodstock), but still low.

• Water temperature was too high and dissolved oxygen too low in summer in some smaller streams eg Glenrae Stream

First line of defence

Check your mailbox for the yellow list of volunteers willing to give up their time in an emergency where the **Automated External Defibrillator** (AED) is needed. Please put this list on your refrigerator or somewhere handy for use in case the AED is required.

- Chairperson of the Motueka Valley Defibrillator Group, Gloria Anderson says your first line of defence is to dial 111 if someone has collapsed, to get medical help. "The volunteers have
- been trained in the use of the AED and could uplift the device for you and assist with its use, if necessary," she says.
- The AED's are at: • The home of Kerry and Paula Hall, 982 Dovedale Road (Woodstock junction)
- Ngatimoti Community Rooms and Fire Station, Motueka Valley Highway (next to Ngatimoti School)
- AED signs are posted at both locations for your assistance. Gloria suggests that you familiarise yourself with these two locations so that in an emergency you will know where the closest location is to your home/workplace/school. Information: Gloria Anderson 526 8644.
