Planting and weed control

Plantings in the past have not always been able to be maintained, so TDC have changed their strategy to put higher numbers of plants on fewer sites which makes maintenance easier and successful plant establishment more likely. TDC plant 15,000 plants per year and maintain these for the following 4 years.

AED Fundraiser

One of the goals of the Motueka Valley Defibrillator Group has been to have an additional AED located on the West Bank of the Motueka Valley. Working towards that goal we have launched a campaign to purchase an additional AED to be located at the Pokororo Hall at the start of the Graham Valley Road.

The Pokororo Women's Club have generously donated \$500 as the seed money toward the purchase. We have requested grant money from Tasman District Council through their Community Grants fund and are awaiting the results of that request.

We are looking to the community to help purchase this very useful emergency device in order for residents on the West Bank to have easier and quicker access to the device. We are also considering the tourists who travel past the hall on their way to Kahurangi National Park and what a bonus it would be to have an AED located in such a rural area.

Why do I need an AED? (Statistics Quoted from the St John Website)

1. Each year more than **2,000 New Zealanders will suffer a** cardiac arrest outside of hospital

2. For **64% of cardiac arrests a bystander** will perform CPR

 People may show no warnings or prior symptoms and 15% survive to hospital discharge following a cardiac arrest
Use of an AED within 3-5 min of collapse can increase the chance of survival by up to 40%

We are seeking your help in purchasing this device. The funds are not only for the purchase of the device and the metal box to contain it, which together, cost \$2,605, but the ongoing costs to replace batteries, CPR training, and replacement patches which expire within approximately 2 years.

No donation is too small. A receipt can be mailed to you upon request.

Let's hope we never need to use it but remember this can save your life, your loved ones life or your neighbour. Let's play it safe and get that AED located at the Pokororo Hall.

Important information regarding the location of your local Defibrillator (AED)

As a reminder to all Motueka Valley residents. We currently have two AED's located in the Motueka Valley. They are outside for easy access. There is one at the Rural Community Rooms (Ngatimoti Rural Fire Station), next to the entrance to the Community Room. An AED sign is posted on the roadside of the Community Rooms. The second one is located at a private residence/business, Kerry and Paula Hall, 1982 Dovedale Road, Woodstock. You will find the AED in a white box mounted to a shed wall at the end of the driveway at their property. It has red paint surrounding the box. There is an AED sign on the fence at the front of the property.

In order to retrieve the AED from the box you need to pull open the latch that is secured with a plastic ziptie, an alarm will sound but don't worry about that. It will reset itself. Your main concern is to get the AED to the person in need as soon as possible while ambulance crew is on their way.

We recommend you all become familiar with these locations in case you need it in an emergency. Remember your first action is to dial 111. The Mot Valley Defibrillator Group has distributed a list of available volunteer community members who will assist you with the AED if you need assistance. Please refer to that list if you are alone and cannot go and retrieve the AED. Do not leave the patient alone.

We are currently conducting a new campaign to purchase an AED to be placed at the Pokororo Hall on the West Bank of the river. More information under a separate article in this newsletter.
