

Water Slide

Towards the Pearse Bridge on the Westbank is a hidden gem. On land that had been a tobacco farm prior to Heather Lindsay and David (Dood) Davies purchasing it 35 years ago is a water slide, which they are happy to share with other valley residents over the

summer for a gold coin donation. Funds raised are donated to local charities. Last year these were donated to the defibrillator group.

Heather's pet project for her grandchildren has grown over the last four years and is now 65 metres long. Initially a shorter slide, Heather extended the length as she watched how people were using it. She has formed the slide's path down the hill, lined it with offcuts of carpet which are covered with tough polypropylene pool liner. The area beside the slide has been cleared of the multitude of unwelcome plants which have been replaced with natives.

Water from springs on the hillside is diverted through a tank, down some pipes,

into a bath and, at the turn of a tap, flows down the slide into wetlands below before ending up in the Motueka River.

Heather provides high density foam mats for people to use on the slide as these protect the liner from wear and tear. There are a few guidelines to follow in order to make sure that everyone can enjoy this activity. Any dogs must be tied up and no inner tubes or boogie boards may be used. Heather has a board outlining these and other simple guidelines. Understandably, use of the slide is at your own risk.

The record for the number of people in a chain on the slide at one time is 17 and the speed of the descent has been timed at 36kph. This sounds like a lot of fun for all ages.

Heather and Dood welcome locals to their property to enjoy the slide and to have a picnic under the walnut trees. The slide can be accessed by vehicles across the paddock beside the house. Heather seems to be one of those people who always has a project or two underway. Currently under construction is a shade area for those watching the activities on the slide. A one kilometre track up the hill, named Mt Hardwalker by one of the grandchildren, is available for the energetic in search of views of the valley.

I've already sent the photos Heather supplied to our annual summer visitors. The reply was a resounding, "Wooooohoooooo. Looks awesome!" It looks like we'll be up there letting gravity do its thing.



Motueka Valley Business Profile Crafted Earth

One of the delightful aspects of my role as reporter for the newsletter is that it gives me the opportunity to meet other valley residents. On a sunny Friday before Labour weekend I had the pleasure of interviewing Joel Briffault of Crafted Earth. During our chat over a cup of Earl Grey tea in his restful garden by the river I discovered that Joel is brimming with positivity and enthusiasm for the valley and for his work.

As a 15 year old living in Hamilton, Joel became aware of the dependence that many have on supermarkets for food and dreamed of doing things in a different way. He was inspired to try his hand at providing vegetables for the family and, much to his mother's consternation, dug a patch in the lawn to begin his first garden. His passion for the earth, plants and gardening was ignited and he pursued a horticultural apprenticeship with the Hamilton Public Gardens and studied at WINTEC, the polytech in Waikato. On completion of this training, with his qualifications to back him up, Joel went off on his O.E. and experienced a wide variety of environments from WWOOFing in North Africa to undertaking garden maintenance in Bristol, England. Eventually, memories of a year spent in the Motueka area called him back to New Zealand and, four years ago, he made the move to the Motueka Valley.

Although this move initially saw him working full time as a gardener, the self-confessed plant obsessive couldn't help himself from growing seedlings and now has what he calls New Zealand's smallest plant nursery. This nursery is at the heart of his business which sees him at the Motueka Sunday market and the Nelson Market on Saturdays with an array of ornamental, bedding, perennial, and organic vegetable and herb seedlings. Tucked in amongst these garden staples are some natives and unusual plants.

Tending the plants, readying them for sale and taking them to market occupies four days a week. Three days a week Joel does garden maintenance. He is qualified and able to undertake many services in this aspect of his business from hedge trimming, pruning, and topiary to consultation about garden construction.

Joel is not a person to sit still for long and has many dreams to expand and develop. His greatest passion is to make a difference to the earth. He wants to provide nutritious organ-

This will initially be done on a small scale, but he intends to be able to feed more families as certainty of supply is firmly established.




