Sound Choice Business Support

Support Far Beyond the Numbers

Before Christmas I popped in to visit Carla Jehle in her cosy little work space at Mytton Heights. With an inspiring view of the valley as a backdrop to her work, Carla runs her business, Sound Choice Business Support which offers a range of services to support small businesses in the district to manage their finances so that they are free to do the work that they know best.

Carla moved to the valley six years ago after 16 years on Waiheke Island. Her interest in sustainable living was challenged by living on an island with its reliance on fossil fuels to connect with the outside world, and prompted a search for a place where the ideals of those on the island were more easily attained. She wished to live and work with like-minded people who were interested in using resources carefully. The Motueka Valley seemed to have what she was looking for in the form of Atamai Village.

Her desire to earn money, minimise travel and use the skills she had developed over her prior work life led Carla to setting up Sound Choice Business Support. Carla was steeped in small business from an early age, growing up in a family of self-employed shoemakers in Germany. She trained in business administration, including bookkeeping, and worked in the corporate world in a large company before moving to New Zealand.

While on Waiheke Island she began using her business administration skills informally, but has now developed this into her main business. Work in the area can be seasonal with ebbs and flows that come with it. Carla can respond to changing needs as she contracts Lenise Mazzucchelli, a local whose family has been in horticulture all her life, when required.

Many small businesses start with a great idea and skills in a specific area, but often struggle with the required paperwork. Carla is able to support at whatever level is needed. Businesses needing help to set up systems to

manage cash flow, payroll, GST, financial reports, track expenses, and other aspects that are difficult to manage manually, or those planning for development, could benefit from having Carla work with them. Much of the work that Carla does with clients can be done remotely. Most of her work is completed online from the valley. Creative Opportunities for Good

The Motueka Valley seems to attract creative people. A recent arrival to our valley is Ali Brown, renowned flax weaver and tutor. Author of several instructional books on flax weaving, which can be purchased through her website, she brings with her a wealth of experience in this field. Her website is packed with information for anyone wishing to explore weaving with harakeke.

Prior to moving to the valley Ali managed an organisation in Christchurch whose vision was for people living with a disability or health issue to gain paid employment. During this time she also attained a Graduate Diploma in Not-For-Profit Management. As a continuation of the philosophy that had been a cornerstone of this employment, Ali and her family have set up a registered charitable trust, the Tutoring for Charity Trust.

The trust aims to generate funds to donate to charities of the trust's choice, which are those working to decrease inequali-



ties in society. It does this by providing workshops, lectures, and seminars to the community. Tutors donate by giving time free of charge. Attendees donate by paying fees for the class.

Under the auspices of the trust, Ali has run some flax weaving workshops at the Ngatimoti community rooms. Funds raised were donated to her former workplace, Catapult Employment Services, and to KidsCan, which provides Kiwi kids in

need with items that enable them to get into the classroom ready to learn. Her next workshop is planned for Saturday 16th of March in the community rooms. Contact Ali if you wish to attend, or see how a workshop runs.

The trust hopes to further its aims by assisting local artists, craftspeople, or anyone with a useful idea to develop their own workshop, talk, or lecture. They provide support with the selection of a suitable venue, advertising, structure and content of the workshop, as well as being available on the day to help the workshop run smoothly. As an experienced tutor, Ali knows what is required to make the day a success. Attracting participants can seem daunting when planning workshops. This burden is eased as the trust manages that aspect.

Many creatives are looking for ways to add to their income. While money generated by workshops run through the trust are not kept by the tutor, the support and experience gained by working alongside Ali to set up, organise and run the workshop could see the creative ready to continue independently.

The flax weaving workshops are full day ones, but other times can be accommodated. Lectures and seminars will often be shorter. If you are interested in being involved in tutoring, presenting or assisting, please contact Ali through her email or website.

When Ali departed I was brimming with ideas for developing writing and other workshops, and using the trust's resources to help them become a reality. She also gave me tips on how to care for the flax on our property. In return, she left with a boot full of harakeke ready for her next experimentation session.


