Looking After Us: FENZ Ngatimoti Voluntary Rural Fire Force

Being responsible for keeping our valley safe from fires and attending other emergencies as required is an extremely commendable job done by a group of community volunteers. Ngatimoti Voluntary Rural Fire Force (VRFF) was the first rural fire station to be formed in the district.

Graham Durrant is the current Controller or Senior Station Officer for our community's Fire/Rescue service. He has been volunteering with Volunteer Rural Fire since it began in 1985 (around 35 yrs). It was originally set-up by the local community with the help of Tasman District Council (TDC). In July 2018, the rural and urban fire services around the country were merged into one under Fire and Emergency New Zealand (FENZ). Prior to that, the Ngatimoti VRFF and others were responsible for their own fundraising to supplement funding from TDC and local forestry companies. Under FENZ, they are now guaranteed funding which allows a much wider range of resources at their disposal such as Medical first response and Swift water rescue equipment to name just a few.

"Nothing has really changed since the merger except our funding is guaranteed. We sign a terms of engagement contract and our appliances and gear are now much more varied as is our training." Graham says.

Currently FENZ Ngatimoti VRFF has 18 active volunteers and they have a fortnightly practice on Wednesday evenings 7 to 9pm at the fire station. There is a permanent Wednesday evening booking at the Community Rooms for the volunteers, so they are able to access relevant power-point presentations for training purposes as needed. They have designated persons who organise training, check appliances and gear, and monthly duty personnel to look after the station area. They have a 4WD Tanker with large water capacity and a modern 4WD Smoke Chaser vehicle which carries up to 5 personnel, portable pumps and a limited amount of water.

Graham volunteers with FENZ Ngatimoti VRFF because:

"...Somebody's got to and I like to help the community." The Durrant family has lived in the valley for three generations. Graham's grandfather first settled in the Pokororo area growing raspberries.

"As our volunteers age, we are always looking for more volunteers. There is a process to become a volunteer with police and medical checks needing to be done. It can take a couple of months."

Irma Jager started volunteering with the fire service eight months ago and she is very enthusiastic about the work:

"... I enjoy being part of the team, they are very welcoming and encouraging. I have realised that everyone has something to offer. Plus we get heaps of training opportunities and through that my confidence is building."

Irma has been involved with putting out a dumped car fire and assisting when some people were stuck in the river.

As Graham says:

"Volunteering with FENZ doesn't mean you have to fight fires. There are many other jobs we need help with. We are often first at the scene, like when a baby was born prematurely and not breathing, the team were able to resuscitate the newborn as the ambulance and rescue chopper arrived to then take over – a very satisfying result for all concerned."

As well as wildfires, the FENZ Ngatimoti VRFF is a first response team for motor vehicle accidents, when powerlines are down, traffic management and medical emergencies. Also, for natural disasters and extreme weather events such as Cyclone Gita in 2018.

"When someone rings 111, the Communications Centre in Christchurch alerts the closest, relevant agency to deal with it. We are backed up by FENZ Motueka Urban Brigade &

FENZ Tasman Rural north of the river and Tapawera Volunteer Fire Brigade to the south.

Over my time with the fire force in the Tasman region we have a proud record for extinguishing any forest fires before they generally exceed 4 to 6 hectares max. Last years' fire at Pigeon Valley was hopefully a one-off major severe weather-driven event that we all learnt an awful lot from."

The Pigeon Valley fire in February 2019 was found to have been accidentally started. The fire got hold in a young pine forest and burnt 2,300 hectares of forest, property and pastures before it was finally controlled and extinguished. It was the third largest bushfire in New Zealand's history. (www.stuff.co.nz/national/114968649/pigeon-valley-fire-cause-confirmed-as-sparks-from-disc-plough)

Most recently, when there was a fire on Mount Lodestone in Kahurangi National Park, FENZ Ngatimoti VRFF responded along with FENZ Tasman VRFF, stationing themselves at Flora Hut. From there, the fire team were able to provide water for the FENZ enlisted helicopter which sprayed water from its monsoon bucket to extinguish the fire quickly. The fire appeared to start from an illegal campfire.

"The most common call-outs are to investigate smoke. Often it's simply when someone is burning off and smoke is spotted and reported. We turn out to investigate and check whether or not a fire permit has been given (and extinguish if not). It's important to note that the use of machinery on an extreme fire risk day can lead to ignition, as was what happened at Pigeon Valley last year."

In this valley and the greater Tasman region burning off is not allowed without a permit which can be applied for online – www.checkitsalright.nz.

If conditions are too dangerous for burning, permits will be revoked and permit holders will be notified. However, it is the owners responsibility to monitor the conditions and if unsure about the appropriate conditions to burn, to check the fire index on the National Institute of Weather and Atmos-

pheric Research (NIWA) – fireweather.niwa.co.nz/region/Nelson%20Tasman.

The Richmond Hill fire lookout is manned 24/7 from late spring till autumn to check for any fires. With the summer season upon us now residents need to be aware of any fire risks around their property and follow the FENZ recommendations.


- Clear grass around electric fences.
- Keep areas around house as green as possible.
- Don't stack wood against outside walls of house.
- Clean gutters and other areas where leaves gather (as sparks will also gather there).
- Have access to water close by.

As of 27 January 2020, a TOTAL FIRE BAN for this area has been issued by FENZ. This means NO Burning Off, NO Fires.


