The MVA is once again excited to present the annual concert at the historic St James Church, Ngatimoti.



MOTUEKA VALLEY BUSINESS PROFILE

The Vet Centre Looking After Our Pets and Animals

Whether you have problems with your cat, dog, budgie or with cows, horses or goats, The Vet Centre have you covered. The Vet Centre has two main clinics in Richmond and Motueka and a smaller branch in Mapua. With a wide range of expertise, both clinics offer a mixed animal service with access to digital x-ray and ultrasound services, surgical and hospital facilities and dentistry. While the majority of work is companion animal based, The Vet Centre also offer an extensive range of equine and farm/large animal services. On Wednesday and Thursday afternoons the vets go out for routine farm work where they build up a number of visits so they can offer subsidised travel to areas such as the Motueka Valley. Outside of those days, the vets fit in the calls as they arise.


At the Motueka centre there's one vet on surgery in the morning with the other vets doing consultations. Two to three vets are always at Motueka centre and one of them will service the Mapua branch as well. The vets are supported by four to five reception staff and veterinary nurses.

Matt Evans, one of the vets at Motueka, has been working at Motueka for eight years:

"This time of year, Spring, brings an increased unpredictability. It's very variable what we get called out for animals not doing well for a variety of reasons - not thriving, problems in and around giving birth, lambing and calving problems and metabolic problems as a result... Or with horses it's often colic situations with abdominal pain that can be mild to severe; or it could be cuts, external trauma wounds from one source or another that we're dealing with. There's never a comfort zone, you've got your booked day and then you've got your random "throw of the dice" element which makes it interesting."

Matt's personal favourite animal are dogs. He's worked with them all his life starting with working at boarding kennels in Christchurch when he has about 10 years old.

The Vet Centre at Motueka is associated with the Royal New Zealand Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, or



SPCA. As the SPCA was centralised into the more main centres, the nearest one now being in Nelson, the SPCA animal centre at Motueka was closed a couple of years ago. The SPCA operates an Op shop a few doors down from The Vet Centre, and The Vet Centre at Motueka acts as a drop-off point and handling point for stray cats:

"We take those strays in and do their initial check-ups, we keep them in for their quarantine periods, look after routine neutering and vaccines needed and look to place them in a new home. If we have too many the main Nelson centre will take them in.", says Matt.

Another service The Vet Centre offers is a Puppy School with socialisation and education classes for young puppies and their owners or handlers. Once the puppies have had their first vaccine, they can be enrolled and have a lesson a week for 4 weeks.

"From the owners' point of view, it's about education – what they should be doing as far as bringing up their dog, how to train them, looking at behaviour aspects, nutrition, parasite treatment and regular health.

From the dog's point of view, it's about socialisation – you've got a window of time because of vaccine requirements where it's difficult to safely socialise dogs. The Puppy

School is a way that allows that gap to be bridged in what is quite an important social development time for the puppy. It builds and works on that bond between puppy and owners or handlers ", says Matt.

Puppy school at the Motueka branch is held on Wednesday evenings at 6pm.

The Vet Centre covers a large area from Rai Valley past Nelson, to and beyond Tapawera, down to the Murchison area and up to the top of Takaka Hill. The Vet Centre is open Monday to Friday 8:30am – 5:30pm and Saturday mornings between 9am and 2pm. The Richmond clinic is open also on Sunday. They offer a 24 hour service, so if your animal needs help after hours it's not a problem. You can ring The Vet Centre's number - 528 8459 - and you'll be automatically put through to the vet on call and get the help you need for your animal.

Controlling Old Man's Beard in the Valley

Old Man's Beard (Clematis vitalba) is a common weed along the Motueka Valley. Old Man's Beard (OMB) is listed as a pest species in the National Pest Plant Accord (NPPA) and the Tasman District Council (TDC) have it listed for sustained control by property owners. Because of concerns about the excessive amount of this weed along parts of the Motueka Valley which aren't already partially dealt with by TDC, a voluntary group formed over three years ago to deal with it.

"It transpired that our area is not controlled because we do not pay a river maintenance levy in our rates, like those downstream do, and also a few upstream. So we decided to strike out on our own and that's the way it still is," says Bruce Stare, co-ordinator of the OMB group.

The OMB group was initially set up after a meeting with Project De Vine. Project De Vine is a non-profit group which works on eradicating or progressively controlling noxious vines throughout Golden Bay. The OMB group are able to purchase the glyphosate gel in bulk through Project De Vine to use with their work trying to eradicate Old Man's Beard. Also, through a grant from QE11 Trust Covenants, the OMB group were able to purchase most of the equipment they need for their work.

"We are currently a group of about 16 and about half that number generally turn up to any one working bee ", says Bruce.

The OMB group have working bees on the last Saturday of each month (except December) weather permitting. They work from 9.30am until lunchtime when the hosts of the property they are working on kindly provide a late morning tea/early lunch.

At present, the property the OMB group are working at is Brookfields, the home of Kim and Judith Rowe. Kim and Judith have a 1200 acre farm on which they run cattle, deer and sheep. They have one area of 37 hectares which has a QE11 covenant. According to an ecological report done for the Tasman District Council in 2010:

"...the site is of exceptional importance as being the largest known alluvial beech-podocarp remnant in the Moutere Ecological District...94 native plant species, three of which are nationally listed as at risk, declining..."

Tom Stein, the QE11 National Trust Representative for Marlborough and Nelson-Tasman, says that: "...Shovel mint, one of those three is now "Threatened – nationally critical". It is found only in the Nelson Marlborough area





and then only known at about 15 sites."

Bruce Stare considers that the covenanted area and two others they are working on are in excellent condition apart from the fact that no weeding has been done for many years:

"There is a major infestation of OMB, even up to the top of the tallest kahikatea and totara trees. There is a lot to do here and our group will be one of several that work on this covenant in future years."

Judith Rowe is very grateful for the work of volunteers:

"It is a huge area of bush and a far bigger task for us to do it on our own. So we have employed a company to manage it, and we need the help of volunteers as well. In order to get funding from DOC we need to show that there's local interest in the area, engaging local schools and volunteers. Funding is dependent on how many volunteer hours are given and we are still waiting to hear" she says.

The OMB group's next working bee at Brookfields is on Saturday 2nd November due to Labour Weekend being on the last Saturday of October. There was a slight increase in the number of people who voted this election. In 2016 local election Voter return was 49.4% being 18,161 returned votes. This 2019 local election Voter return was 51.68% with 19,846 returned votes.






