MOTUEKA VALLEY BUSINESS PROFILE

Doctor Dig

Byron McEnroe must have the best views from any workplace around. A quick glance of his Facebook page shows his diggers in the glorious countryside that we are lucky enough to call home.

Byron, the owner of Doctor Dig Ltd., grew up in the Motueka district, moving to the West Bank when he was eight. His early life on farms and familiarity with farm machinery led him to pursue a career as a digger driver. Prior to establishing his own business, he was employed in the industry for many years, several of them in the Ashburton District which included work following the Canterbury earthquakes. He began small, as many sole enterprises do, but now employs three full-time staff, and has been recently joined by his wife, Leonie, to help with administration and organisation. His fleet now includes five diggers, two dump trucks, one roller, one grader loader, and a 6 wheeler road truck. The risk he took to sell his house and sink everything he owned into the business has paid off as his reputation for quality work to produce a finish to a high standard at a reasonable price has established him in the district. Byron strongly believes in getting the work done right, the first time.

The staff at Doctor Dig undertake a variety of work, including ground development, foundations, subdivisions, driveways, river work, including gravel extraction, the realignment and construction of rock walls, the removal of large tree stumps and dangerous trees, burying large animals for farmers and clearing ex-forestry land. Most jobs that are too big for the tools and equipment owned by many valley residents can be undertaken by Byron and his team. Many smaller jobs can be undertaken at the first visit, while larger jobs may require an estimate after a site inspection. Weather and ground conditions are the determining factor for scheduling a job, as the safety of staff and the customer is paramount, especially when dealing with the steep sites in the district.

While ex-tropical cyclone Gita is a distant memory for many of us, the Doctor Dig team have only just finished with the work that was created as a result of that event. They spent six weeks in Marahau with three dump trucks tackling the mess that was created by the wind and rain in that area.

With the granite base that underlies much of the valley Byron and his team need to employ a variety of methods to move earth and rocks. They hold an explosives licence and are able to make short work of large rocks, tree stumps, and to make post holes in rock. Their licence ensures that the ap-

Enhancing the Soil

Soil is something that many urban dwellers think little about, but to gardeners and farmers the health of the soil is the basis for the health of their plants and animals. A recent visit to the property where Irma Jager and Jan-Albert Droppers live on the Westbank saw me talking about, of all things, the soil. With my husband's country upbringing, agricultural studies and passion for soil health it seemed to be a good idea to drag him along to interpret.

Research into methods of enhancing soil health has led Irma and Jan-Albert to adopt practices, which might seem counterintuitive, but that studies have shown lead to improvements in the land, and over time could return infertile soils to fertility and halt the desertification of large areas of land.

Irma had directed me to a Ted talk (link below) by Allan Savory, a Zimbabwean ecologist, livestock farmer, and cofounder of the Savory Institute. He advocates using bunched and moving livestock to mimic nature, as a means to heal the environment, stating "only livestock can reverse desertification. There is no other known tool available to humans with which to address desertification that is contributing not only to climate change, but also to much of the poverty, emigration, violence, etc. in the seriously affected regions of the world."

My understanding of the theory is that holistic planned grazing mimics the behaviour of herds that once grazed the grasslands. Grazing animals naturally group together as a defence mechanism and move regularly in order to have sufficient food for the herd. The dung they leave behind enhances the health of the soil. By the time they return weeks or months later, the fertility of the soil has increased as evidenced by the increase in worm numbers, and the proliferation of a variety of grass types. Holistic planned grazing was

developed to ensure that no plants are overgrazed, few if any plants are overrested, and the soil is only trampled at any one place for a few days followed by recovery time.

Irma and Jan-Albert embraced the ideas and changed grazing practices on their smallholding six years ago. They subdivide the existing paddocks, with solar-powered electric fences, into smaller areas that have been calculated as providing sufficient feed for the number of cows for one day. The animals are moved daily and will not come back to the same piece of land for at least a month. Jan-Albert moves the cows in the mid-afternoon so that they get the best possible pickings from the plants when it is at its peak nutritional value. The animals' feed is supplemented by hay in the winter, but at a rate that is half that which was required previously using traditional grazing practices. The stock, soil, and grass are observed frequently with this commitment to moving the stock daily which aids in tweaking the plan for the best outcomes for the animals. An added bonus is that the parasitic cycle is interrupted which negates the need for drenching.


