

# **Our River and Us**

Celebrating our beautiful Motueka River catchment, Motueka District Museum latest exhibition is *Our River and Us*. The exhibition looks at how we relate to the river with a pictorial history of the river displayed on the walls. A detailed map shows the length of the river from its headwaters in the Richmond Ranges at Porter Ridge to its mouth at the Motueka delta flowing into Tasman Bay. People can follow the river along a floor installation which showcases the recreational aspects of the river. There is even a pond with trout and fishing rods. Children can get a fishing licence when they arrive at the museum and then have a go at fishing for trout, using the catch and release method.

Motueka Catchment Collective have a display also highlighting the regenerative work that is being done in the catchment. The issues which concern the catchment community such as forestry, flooding, gravel extraction and pest control, as identified by the Collective, make up their display.

"This exhibition is aimed to gather local interest," says Jen Calder the museum's curator, "And we want to gather more stories from locals about the river. After all the work the council has done over the years with stopbanks, the river still floods, and the debris still washes out to Tasman Bay."

Our River and Us will be open until end of July at Motueka District Museum, High Street, Tuesday to Friday 10am – 3pm and Sunday 10am – 2pm.



# MOTUEKA VALLEY OLD MANS BEARD WEED BUSTING GROUP

About five years ago a group of locals from the middle Motueka River Valley got into a conversation about the increasing infestation of pest plants along the banks of the Motueka River, especially, but also up its tributaries and into peoples' properties. There seemed to have been a steady increase in the amount of Old Man's Beard smothering trees and native bush remnants, as well as real increase in the amount of convolvulus flowering happening on the river banks. They had heard about the great work that Project DeVine was doing in Golden Bay and thought about setting up a local group to do the same job. As luck would have it, Project DeVine set up a public meeting in Ngatimoti to assess the public interest, although they were not interested in being directly involved themselves as Golden Bay was keeping them sufficiently occupied. But representatives from both the Tasman District Council and the Queen Elizabeth II Trust were present and supportive of a local Motueka Valley weed busting group being established.

From that meeting a number of volunteers agreed to form our own local weed busting group, and a number of potential clients wanting help with Old Man's Beard (OMB) removal also made themselves known. Thus, it was a relatively simple matter to organise a group of volunteers to visit sites and assist local valley inhabitants deal with their OMB. It soon became clear that a key area to start with was the bush remnants protected as Covenants under the Queen Elizabeth II Trust and the group has continued with this priority to the present day. However, other sites of remnant bush, especially those whose owners are interested in having their reserve becoming a Queen Elizabeth II Covenant, are also considered. Additionally, the Tasman District Council has begun clearing sections of the local river banks and carrying out intensive planting of them in natives. Long term, it is hoped these two activities will help reduce the amount of OMB and other pest plants.

The weed busting group has now been operating for about five years. "It has been gratifying to see the improvements resulting from our work, and our clients are also highly expressive in their thanks. It is really good to see the huge amount of regrowth of native plants in these bush reserves once the pest plants have been removed. This is now up to head-hight and flourishing; exactly what is needed to encourage native wildlife to return and expand their presence knowing that food resources and shelter are now more readily available. As with many activities over the past few years, the number of volunteer members we have available to do this important work has decreased as a result of lock downs and Covid, along with the insecurity that that has created across the nation. We are very happy to welcome new members for next year's programme which will consist of visits to ten covenants, all sited within the Motueka Valley Catchment. Our working bees take place on the last Saturday morning of the month, from February to November. All gear and any training necessary are provided.

# 'Our Regenerative Future' One Farmer's transition from traditional sheep and cattle farming to a more economic and biologically resilient farm

Greg grew up on a family farm near Methven, Mid-Canterbury. After gaining a Bachelor of Agriculture from Massey University and working in the agriculture industry, he and his wife Rachel worked in partnership with Greg's parents to develop Mangarara Station in Hawke's Bay. After the birth of their first child in 2000, Greg and Rachel began thinking about their legacy and the world they would be leaving for future generations.

He is transitioning the 600 hectare traditional sheep and cattle station to a farm of the future that creates balance by developing diverse, integrated, regenerative farming systems, stacking layers of different production streams and restoring ecosystems through tree planting, sequestering carbon from the atmosphere and building healthy soil using holistic grazing techniques. He is developing an economically and biologically resilient farm system. The ethos for the farm is "Optimising Life."


