An Essential Oil Journey



Essential Oils have been used for eons across different cultures. They are the volatile aromatic compounds which are there to protect the plant and to attract pollinators. When these essential oils are extracted they can have a therapeutic use for humans and animals working on physical, mental and

emotional levels. They can be added directly into a diffuser, diluted and used on the skin, in a spray, and some can be used as food flavouring. Currently, around 3,000 different volatile aromatic compounds have been identified.

Andrea Blackburn, 'Living Well', Ngatimoti, has been studying and working with essential oils for the past few years: "I used to use them in my younger days, I'd put them in an oil burner until I learnt better- heating them changes the chemical composition," she says, "...But I never got into them in a big way."

Then her own health issues made her look further into the benefits of essential oils: "I ended up on quite a lot of medications all at once, and my body started to react...I realised things needed to change so I talked with my GP at the time about weaning off the medications safely..."

With her husband Ian and their two Jack Russells, Andrea moved here from Wellington four years ago. She met an aromatherapist who helped her with some essential oils to support her, some changes around nutrition and proper supplements to use: "...and between my aromatherapist, research and working with my GP I managed to get off all my prescription medications within 6 months."

Having seen what a big difference using good quality essential oils could make, Andrea started using them more and more with friends, family, and with their dogs. She de-toxed the household making her own cleaning products like glass cleaners, toilet cleaners and a general surface spray.

Wanting to learn more about the use and benefits of essential oils, pre-covid Andrea attended a number of workshops, events and conventions. During lockdown she took an essential oil certificate course on-line. One of her 'bibles' is Modern Essentials.

A key thing to remember when buying essential oils is the importance of the quality. As Andrea says: "...many of the essential oils you can buy from around the world are either contaminated by heavy metals and pesticides or adulterated in the process of the making of the oils, or both. So it is really important to do your own homework and research on the oils you are buying."

Andrea uses a range of oils regularly: "Lavender, peppermint, frankincense...I have lemon every day, I flavour my water with it, and around the house I use a protective blend which includes orange, clove and cinnamon."

Andrea will have a stall at Ngatimoti Festival October 23rd and at the 'Healing Expo' in Motueka 19th November. She will be running regular themed sessions at the Ngatimoti Community Room such as detoxing your home, and supporting aches and pains: "I'm really passionate about helping people and sharing what I have learnt.

I've done a couple of workshops so far, and the idea is not just to share my knowledge but also for others to share their stories and knowledge."

Improving Your Vinyl Experience with *The Wand*

There has been a 'Vinyl revival' and many music enthusiasts prefer playing records on turntables to get a better and more real listening experience. Whether it's old LPs we've kept, second-hand LPs scored from an op shop or new releases, to improve that listening experience Simon Brown has designed The Wand Tonearm, The Wand Turntable and The Wand EQ Phono Stage amplifier.

Living in a tiny house, with a portacabin office he shares with his wife Jean, Simon has been able to continue his award-winning design work with his business DesignBuildListen.com. Jean and Simon moved to the valley before Christmas last year and are in the process of designing and drafting plans for their house.

As a mechanical engineer, Simon worked for Fisher & Paykel as part of their design team for over25 years, mostly designing cooktops, as well as a brief time in the UK designing electric lawn mowers. He has always been interested in product design: "Because we were living in Dunedin and wanting to move to a lifestyle block I was looking for something else to do and I could see 10 years ago that vinyl was on the increase. People were starting to make turntables but nobody was making arms..."

The Wand Tonearm was launched in 2011 and has won multiple design awards and five star reviews both in New Zealand and internationally, including a silver and a bronze New Zealand Industrial Design Award. Considered a 'step change in tonearm design', The Wand Tonearm is made of carbon fibre which Simon gets in two metre lengths. He then cuts and drills it himself. They are available in three lengths - 9.5", 10.3" and 12" and three specification levels – The Wand Plus, The Wand Master and S (Master Lite) series. The Master series is also available as a 14" model to special order.

Simon then turned to designing turntables and The Wand Turntable Model 14-4 was launched in 2019. It has a 14" diameter multilayer platter and a computer-machined antivibration chassis. The casing is plywood which Simon handsaws and coats with manuka beeswax. A recent review from HiFiTest in

Germany concluded: 'If you are looking for a turntable with a difference that will bring some sunshine and fun to the system – this is it...'

The Wand EQ Phono Stage was launched in 2020. It was designed by friend Gary Morrison, a renowned amplifier maker who died last year. Continuing Gary's legacy, the EQ's electronics are made in New Zealand, and the amplifier can be fitted inside The Wand 14-4 turntable or purchased separately.

As much as possible, Simon has the parts made locally to his specifications so the products are 90% New Zealand content: "One of the good things about New Zealand is that we can get stuff made in low volume. Since moving here, I have parts machined out the back of Brightwater. I started making arms using carbon fibre because, again, New Zealand has a good carbon fibre industry."

There are a dozen or more distributors of The Wand products around the world but mostly orders come from UK, Germany, USA and Australia. "They are sold in the audio enthusiast market, similar to those enthusiasts who would be happy to pay \$6000 plus for a mountain bike," Simon says. For connoisseurs of music, The Wand tonearms, turntables and amplifiers aim to improve 'the experience of that special musical magic that vinyl is able to reproduce'.

Simon is still growing the business and plans to do an occasional local market as the weather improves and tourists return.




