Road speed

The Tasman and Nelson Councils have developed a detailed, draft Speed Management Plan which is open for review and public input until the end of February 2024. The proposed changes to speed limits are extensive and likely to affect many of the regions roads and residents. Caramel & Chocolate Christmas Crackers

100g plain salted crackers (Salada works well) 225g butter 3/4 cup brown sugar 200g dark chocolate chopped 1/2 cup pistachios chopped

1. Preheat oven 1900

1/2 cup dried cranberries

- 2. Line baking tray (approx 22 x 33cm) with baking paper, put crackers in without overlapping, break to fit
- 3. Melt butter & sugar, stir well until combined & bubbling, pour over crackers evenly, put in oven 8-10 minutes until bubbling all over
- 4. Remove from oven & sprinkle chocolate over, return to oven for 1 min until chocolate melted enough to spread with a knife
- 5. Sprinkle pistachios & cranberries over & leave until just set before cutting into pieces
- can be stored in an airtight container for up to a week

Christmas Fruit Cake with a Twist

- 2 tbsp ground flaxseed (linseed)
- 6 tbsp water
- 1 1/2 cups ground almond flour
- 1/2 cup coconut flour
- 1/2 cup stewed apple
- 1/4 cup date purée
- 2 cups mashed banana (~ 4 bananas)
- 2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1. Preheat oven 170C $\mathfrak S$ oil a loaf tin (12cm $\mathfrak X$ 23cm) or cake tin.
- 2. Mix flaxseed g water in a bowl g let it thicken for 5-10 mins
- 3. Míx the stewed apple, date purée, mashed bananas & flaxseed míx.
- Tip: if you don't have stewed apple or date purée grate an apple, add 1/4 cup dates & bit water & simmer until can mash to a paste
- 4. Add in rest of the ingredients & mix
- 5. Place batter in tin g bake for 50 mins or until skewer comes out clean. Remove g cool on wire rack.
